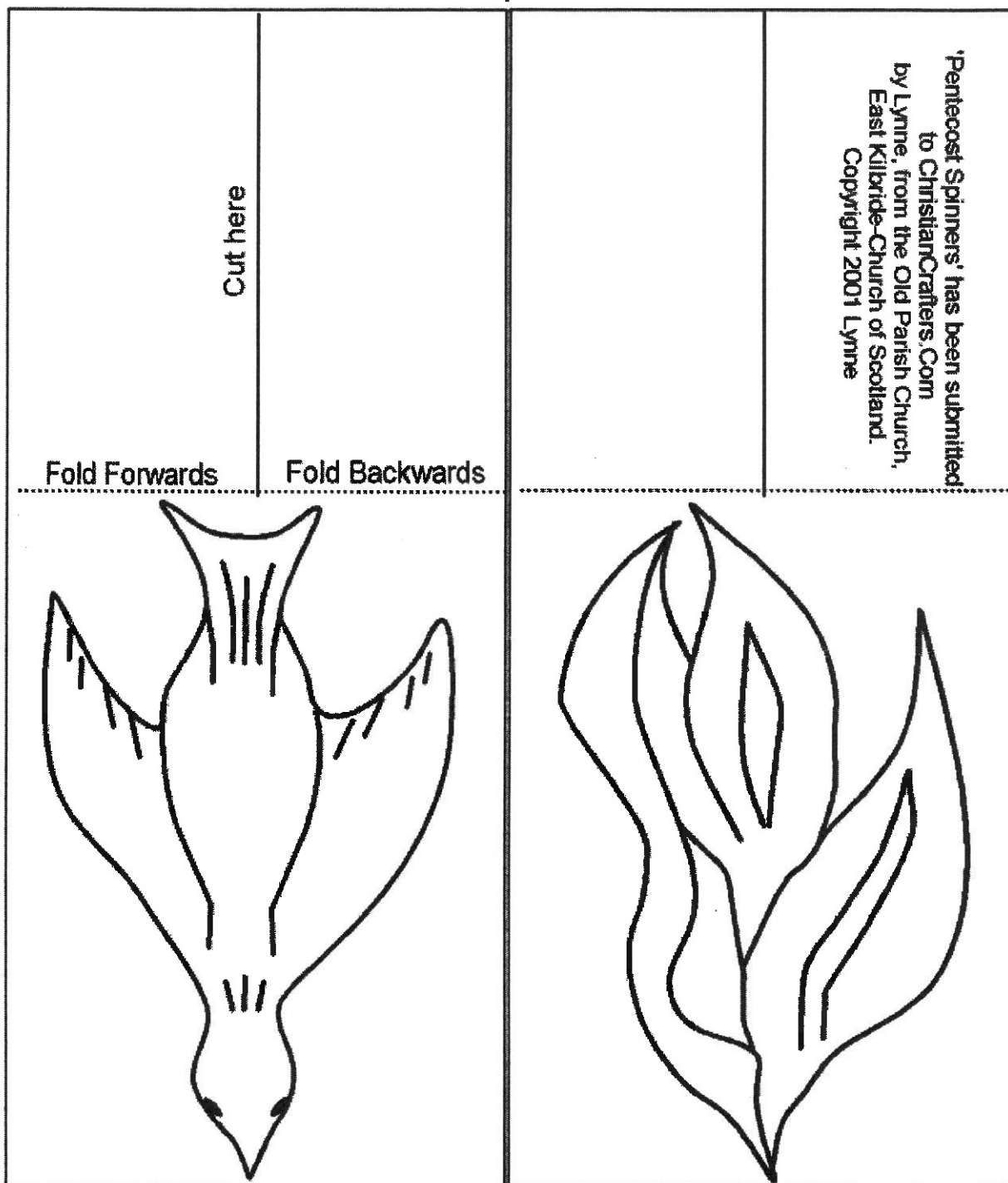
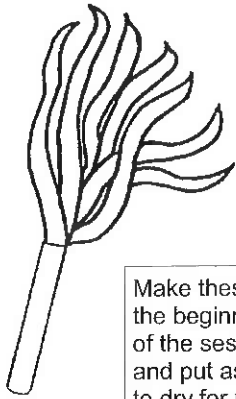


- 1) Print this page onto white card stock paper.
- 2) Color the dove and tongues of fire.
- 3) Fold card in half lengthwise at the arrow.
- 4) Cut out the card, and staple or glue stick shut.
- 5) Attach a paper clip where indicated.

Make these at the beginning of the session and put aside to dry for use in the story later.

Pentecost Flames

Materials:

- ♦ pop-sticks
- ♦ red, yellow and orange crepe paper cut into 3cm X 30cm strips (2 of each colour per child)
- ♦ craft glue or sticky tape

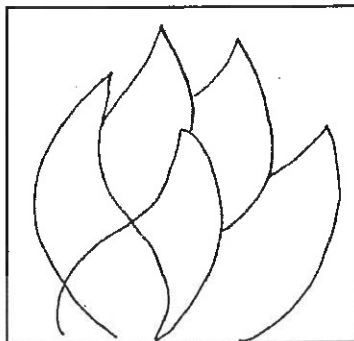
Suggestion:

Try gluing and sticky taping the crepe paper yourself beforehand: you may decide one is easier than the other, or one works better.

Method:

- ♦ Children glue or tape the coloured crepe paper strips on to one end of the pop-stick.
- ♦ Children can write their name on the stick if they wish to identify their own to take home at the end of the next session.

Pentecost Flame Collages



Materials:

- ♦ black paper or card
- ♦ scraps of red, yellow and orange material or paper,
- ♦ scissors, glue

Give each child a piece of black paper or card, some coloured material or paper, scissors and glue, and let them loose to create their own flame picture on the black background.

Pictures can be A4 or A5 size, depending on how much you are prepared to spend on black paper! It is a good idea to do one yourself as an example.

To save time you can cut the flame shapes out beforehand, especially if you are using material.

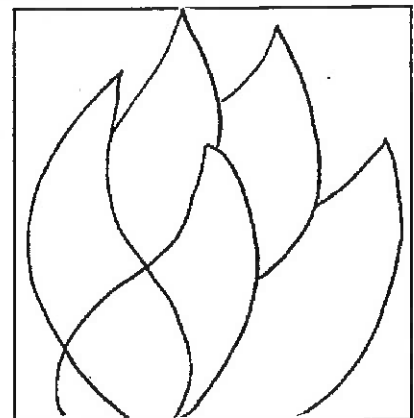
String and alfoil picture

Materials:

- ♦ recycled cardboard (from biscuit or cereal packets) – an A5 sized piece for each child
- ♦ string
- ♦ white craft glue
- ♦ alfoil
- ♦ bright flame coloured textas
- ♦ scissors
- ♦ sticky tape or masking tape
- ♦ ribbon for hanger.

Method:

- ♦ Cut various lengths of string no longer than the piece of cardboard, including a few shorter ones to fill in gaps.
- ♦ Arrange string on card to represent the shape of flames rising.
- ♦ Where necessary cut string to fit.
- ♦ Trickle white craft glue along lines where string is to go.
- ♦ Glue string in place.
- ♦ Allow a little time to dry.
- ♦ *(Helpful hint: popsticks are useful for trickling white craft glue, rather than letting children loose with the bottle.)*
- ♦ Tear off a piece of alfoil about 5cm larger all round than the cardboard.
- ♦ Gently smooth the alfoil over the card, and secure in place on the back with sticky tape or masking tape (not too tight).
- ♦ On the front, gently press the alfoil into the hollows inside the string outlines.
- ♦ Using flame coloured textas, colour in the flames inside the string outlines, one colour per section.
- ♦ Attach a hanger in the centre of the back.



- ♦ *Caution: Be gentle when pressing the alfoil and when colouring to avoid puncturing or tearing the alfoil.*

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
